




MEXICO CITY • When he retired to San Diego after 28 years in the U.S. Marines, Gregory Gillispie thought his working days were behind him, but he soon got bored.

To keep busy, he launched an airplane brokerage, which was hired just July to transport Canadian Cynthia Vanier and her entourage to wartime Libya for a fact-finding mission. Eight months later, two of Mr. Gillispie's business associates are in a Mexico jail, accused of conspiring with Ms. Vanier to smuggle members of Libya's Gaddafi family to an oceanfront hideaway near Puerto Vallarta.

And Mr. Gillispie has himself been dragged into it, identified by Mexican authorities as a suspect in the bizarre international plot to allegedly relocate Saadi Gaddafi and his wife, Nadeem Esmail, a senior fellow at the Fraser Institute

An Islamist gunman who admitted shooting dead seven people, including three children, taunted French police who besieged his apartment Wednesday that he was on a "mission" from al-Qaeda.

Mohamed Merah, armed with several guns and suspected of having grenades, held off hundreds of police who surrounded his flat, despite promising several times to surrender. At midnight in France, three large explosions were heard and it was believed commandos had started to storm the building.

But Interior Minister Pierre-Henry Brandet later said the explosions were, "to intimidiate the gunman who seems to have changed his mind and does not want to surrender. There is no assault."

As the siege entered its second day, authorities were having to face difficult questions about how a known Islamist, who had twice travelled to Afghanistan, and who had been under surveillance

\$100-billion
on health,
nothing to
show: study

OTTAWA • The Canadian health-care system has proven to be a black hole for federal tax dollars over the past decade or so, says a new report. Despite hikes in federal transfers to provinces for health care that were \$97.6-billion beyond what was needed to account for inflation and population growth in the past 13 years, there has been little improvement in access to care for Canadians, says the Fraser Institute study released Wednesday.

As an example, the report noted the time it takes to get treatment from a specialist after a referral from a general physician. The median time was 19 weeks last year, up almost 60% from 1997.

"Canadians should have expected the health-care system to improve, and it's troubling that there has not been an improvement in spite of this very large increase in health-care expenditures since 1997-98," said Nadeem Esmail, a senior fellow at the Fraser Institute



Russians 'advised Quinn nephew on property deals'

A nephew of former US senator Charles E. Grassley has been indicted on federal corruption charges, including mail and wire fraud, in connection with his role in a scheme to secretly wire transfer millions of dollars from a Russian company to a US-based law firm, according to court documents.

WHAT HAPPENED: US District Court Judge H. Carl Moulton issued a search warrant for the home of Quinn's nephew, James Quinn, 31, of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, on March 13. The search was conducted by agents from the FBI and the Iowa State Auditor's office.

Quinn, who is the son of US Senator Charles E. Grassley, 73, of Iowa, was indicted on March 13 on two counts of mail and wire fraud, according to court documents.

The indictment states that Quinn and his co-conspirators used their influence as members of the Senate Finance Committee to "advise" the Russian company, which is controlled by a member of the Russian government, to wire millions of dollars to a US-based law firm, according to court documents.

Quinn's attorney, Michael J. Coughlin, told reporters that Quinn had no knowledge of the scheme and was "completely innocent," according to court documents.

Toulouse, France—A French national suspected of a string of deadly attacks that have gripped France remained pinned inside a Toulouse apartment by French special forces Wednesday evening, as prosecutors characterized the previous week as an Islamist radical man.

French authorities tracked the suspect to a four-story apartment building in Toulouse's Old Payne residential neighborhood, about two miles south of the Toulouse private Jewish school where Mr. Merah is suspected of killing a teacher and three children at point-blank range Monday, at 3 a.m. Wednesday local time. French SWAT

forces surrounded the building. Authorities said earlier Wednesday that Mr. Merah was speaking to a negotiator and had claimed responsibility for the attacks. They said he had promised to surrender but was still at large Wednesday afternoon.

But as night fell, the standoff continued. Additional special forces troops arrived on the scene. At around 8:30 p.m., Mr. Merah appears to have been on the radar of French

authorities, who had been planning to strike again that day.

French police on Wednesday named Mohammed Merah, a 25-year-old Toulouse resident of Algerian descent, as the suspect in the shooting deaths of four people at a Jewish school on Monday, as well as in the fatal shootings of three soldiers the previous week.

Deutsche Bank Shields U.S. Unit From New Law

The technical change has important consequences. That means—which at the end of last year had about \$35.1 billion of assets and 8,652 employees—marking it one of the largest U.S. banking companies—won't have to comply with a provision of the U.S. Dodd-Frank regulatory overhaul law that essentially forces the jobs of non-U.S. banks to meet the same capital requirements that American banks face.

The bank on Feb. 1 reorganized its U.S. subsidiary, known as Taunus Corp., so that it is no longer classified as a bank holding company, according to disclosures by the bank and on the U.S. Federal Reserve's website. One is a trust company that has a banking license and must adhere to stringent U.S. bank safety rules. The other is an investment banking arm that isn't

technically a bank. Until recently, both units were housed under Taunus, which didn't meet to meet U.S. capital requirements, thanks to a waiver provided by the Fed a decade ago.

A provision of the Dodd-Frank Act, designed to prevent a repeat of the financial crisis, required the law under which that waiver and others were granted. That change was going to require Deutsche Bank to inflate Taunus, which for years operated with thin capital cushions, with what executives feared could be as much as \$20 billion, according to people familiar with the matter.



Patstelling dreigt voor Dexia

Dexia wil maar 25 miljoen euro vergoeding betalen voor de 54,5 miljard euro staatsgaranties die het van ons land zou krijgen. De regering gaat niet akkoord.

BRUSSEL Dexia heeft gisteren bij Europan zijn herstructureringsplan ingediend. In dat plan worden de overheden vrijwel niet vergoed voor de risico's die ze lopen in het dossier. Dexia stelt een lastvergoeding voor van 5 basispunten, of 0,05 procent, voor de overheidsgaranties van maximaal 50 miljard euro die het bij zijn redding, in oktober, toegezegd kreeg. Op

de garanties die het kreeg bij zijn eerste redding, in 2008, betaalt het engeveert het tienvoudige.

Frankrijk verdedigt het plan, dat derdeico's voorbij het huidige leeftijdsonderzoek 5 procent van de garanties. Het plan van Dexia moet nu goedkeurd worden door de Europese Commissie. Europa's commissaris Joaquín Almunia gaat in de eerste plaats na of er geen sprake is van ongeoorloofde staatssubsidie. Opgallend is alvast dat België voorbehoud

heeft genoemd bij het plan, zowel bij Dexia als bij Europa. Minister van Financiën Steven Vanackere zegt dat de opinie van Europa richtinggevend 'zal zijn'.
